
Alexander Inn / AT HISTORIC OAK RIDGE, TN




- The Alexander Inn was a two-story hotel known as "The Guest House".
- Hosted US President John F. Kennedy & Wife Jackie Kennedy.
- Hosted top military officials & physicists as the Manhattan
 Project was being conducted closeby.
- It was abandoned in the 1990s after the Manhattan Project ended.

Every Building has a hSTORY







- 40 Assisted Living & 20 Memory Care Units
- 41,040 SF
- \$9 million in restoration costs
- Local 90% 10 year tax break PILOT
- Historic Tax Credits
- \$500,000 from Oak Ridge Heritage & Preservation Association & Department of energy









- Fire rated assemblies with historic interior wood trim & molding that couldn't be removed
- Narrow corridors
- Creating marketable senior living unit out of small hotel rooms
- Accessibility
- Lack of elevators & enclosed stair towers

ctalwood School

- Oakwood Senior Living was a local
 elementary school known as
 "Oakwood Elementary"
- Sat in disrepair for 20 years
- Knox Heritage places Oakwood on the 2009 'Fragile 15' list of endangered historic places
- Acquired property in 2012, opened in 2015

Every Building has a hSTORY



- 55,000 SF
- 62 apartments assisted & memory care
- Low acquisition cost \$1 dollar from county surplus
- Local PILOT
- \$9 million investment







- The renovation effort took twice as long as normal because of condition of structure's shell.
- Large classrooms and window arrangements made units configurations challenging.
- Fire & roof damages made structure unstable.
- Making the entrance gym feel to scale & welcoming.








- Knoxville High School was built in 1910.

Fire rated assemblies

- Maintaining the historic tin ceilings were part of the historic tax credit criteria
- Programing wide corridors
- Lack of elevators & enclosed stair towers
- Finding interstitial space to conceal all the building infrastructure upgrades.
